GOAL – \$10,000 in donations to fund a state-of-the-art Finish Lynx automatic timing system plus scholarships to deserving members of the senior classes of William Tennent High School donated through the William Tennent Alumni Association and the Montgomery Memorial Meet. The timing system will be gifted to the school during the 2022 Montgomery Memorial Meet, and a plaque will be included on the Wall Of Honor in the stadium dedicating the system in Ken's honor and listing the Montgomery Memorial Meet, Colleagues and Friends of Ken, Alumni, and Friends of Tennent Track and Field as donors. The Finish Lynx system will be used to time home dual meets, the Montgomery Memorial Meet, and any League Championship meets held at Tennent.

#### BACKGROUND – Ken Montgomery, WTHS track athlete and class of 1957, returned to Tennent after college and became a Phys. Ed. and Health teacher, department chairperson, and the boys' head track coach. Ken was also instrumental in Black and White Night, serving for several years as the director. Perhaps the most memorable track highlight for Ken was leading his 1976 Boys' Track Team to the District One Championship. Ken passed away in 1997 after a battle with cancer.

In 1998, head Tennent Girls' and Boys' Track coaches, Ted Abel and John Goldsworthy, began an annual track and field invitational to honor the late Ken Montgomery and to commemorate his legacy. It is held annually on the Thursday evening the week following the Penn Relays. Initially we hosted 8 boys' and 8 girls' teams; however, since that time the Montgomery Memorial Meet has grown into one of the premier track invitationals in southeastern Pennsylvania. In 2019 we hosted 22 boys' and 22 girls' teams, including many of the top athletes in the tri-county area. The efficiency, professionalism, and outstanding results of the meet have often been cited by visiting teams as reasons for their returns to our competition, making the meet so popular that we have had to cap the number attending in order to finish at a decent time of night. Our meet is completely self-sufficient, relying on entry fees and donations to meet all of our expenses.

This summer the Claude Lodge field and the track and jumping areas will be completely re-done: new astroturf, new track surface, and new runways. To add to the excellent facility the district is revitalizing for Tennent student/athletes, the Montgomery Memorial Meet directors (see above) have partnered with the William Tennent Alumni Association in a fund-raising challenge so that we can purchase a new Finish Lynx timing system. Any funds raised above the \$10,000 goal will be used to increase the annual Alumni Association senior scholarships. Since the WTAA is a 501 (c) 3 non-profit, any donations are tax-deductible.

THE CHALLENGE - Goal? Raise at least \$10,000. Donations in excess of \$10,000 will go to the WTAA Scholarship fund.
